IN RE 2021 JUNETEENTH FEDERAL HOLIDAY

GENERAL ORDER NO. 400

On June 17, 2021, President Joseph Biden signed into law the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act which establishes June 19 as Juneteenth National Independence Day, a federal holiday commemorating the notice of the end of slavery in the United States. Because June 19 falls on a Saturday in 2021, the U.S. Office of Personnel Management has announced that most federal employees will observe the holiday on Friday, June 18, 2021.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that in recognition of the newly created holiday and in celebration of the significance of the event Juneteenth commemorates, the United States Courthouses located in Pocatello, Idaho and Coeur d'Alene, Idaho will be closed on Friday, June 18, 2021. Because of previously scheduled court hearings that cannot be rescheduled, the United States Courthouse in Boise, Idaho will open at 7:30 a.m. on Friday, June 18, 2021, and remain open until 12:00 p.m. At that time, the United States Courthouse in Boise, Idaho will close for the remainder of the day and will reopen at 7:30 a.m. on Monday, June 21, 2021.
