GENERAL ORDER NO. 394

Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 5 and 83, Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 49, and Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure 5005(a)(2), 9011, 9029 and 9036, authorize this Court to establish practices and procedures for the filing, signing, noticing, and verifying pleadings and papers by electronic means. In the District and Bankruptcy Court, unless exempted for good cause shown, all attorneys must become a Registered Participant of CM/ECF.

The Electronic Case Filing Practices and Procedures for the United States District and Bankruptcy Court for the District of Idaho were initially established in November 2004 by the adoption of General Order No. 187 and were subsequently amended and modified by General Order No. 247.

By adoption of this General Order, previous General Order No. 247 is superseded and the Court hereby authorizes the Clerk of Court to establish, promulgate, amend or modify the Electronic Case Filing ("ECF") Procedures, as needed, subject to approval by the Chief Judges.
