COMES NOW, Debtors, Frank Chapin and Sydney Gutierrez-Chapin, by and through undersigned counsel, Bruce A. Anderson of Elsaesser Jarzabek Anderson Marks Elliott & McHugh, Chtd., and moves to continue the confirmation hearing on the Disclosure Statement currently set for Monday, June 9, 2003 until July 8, 2003, or as soon thereafter as can be heard.

In support thereof, Debtors state as following:

1. Debtors are continuing to gather information and preparing the accountings on the Van Schravendyk estate matter. An objection has been filed and it is anticipated that once the accounts are filed, which will be before July 8, 2003, any objections will be resolved.

2. The Debtors continue their preparation of tax returns for them individually, and for all related entities that they control. The tax returns cover at least 8 years and it is anticipated that they will be filed with the IRS, with copies to the Assistant U.S. Attorney Warren Derbige, before July

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
8, 2003. The Debtors have consented and have stipulated with the Internal Revenue Service for stay relief for the U.S. Tax Court matters to continue forward. It is hoped that once the returns are filed, agreed tax figures will be assessed.

4. The Plan, as it is now styled now, is not joined by Frank and Sydney Chapin. Many matters need to be resolved with Frederick Leaf in order to arrive at a joint consensual plan. It is anticipated that a separate objection to confirmation will be filed by Debtors.

5. The issues set forth herein go to the heart of any reorganization/liquidation and must be resolved before confirmation. Debtors are not asking for a lengthy delay and such delay rather than being prejudicial to plan proponent Frederick Leaf, or to the creditors, should act to work out more efficiently issues that must be resolved.
