

**INSTRUCTIONS FOR PROOF OF CLAIM FORM 04-01002**

*The instructions and definitions below are general explanations of the law. In particular types of cases or circumstances, such as bankruptcy cases that are not filed voluntarily by a debtor, there may be exceptions to these general rules.*

**DEFINITIONS**

<p><b>Debtor</b> The person, corporation, or other entity that has filed a bankruptcy case is called the debtor.</p> <p><b>Creditor</b> A creditor is any person, corporation or other entity to whom the debtor owed a debt on the date the bankruptcy case was filed</p> <p><b>Proof of Claim</b> A form telling the bankruptcy court how much the debtor owed a creditor at the time the bankruptcy case was filed ( the amount of the creditors claim). This form must be filed with the clerk of the bankruptcy court where the bankruptcy case was filed.</p>	<p><b>Secured Claim</b> A claim is a secured claim to the extent that the creditor has a lien on property of the debtor (collateral) that gives the creditor the right to be paid from that property before creditors who do not have liens on the property</p> <p>Examples of liens are a mortgage on real estate and a security interest in a car, truck, boat, television set or other item of property. A lien may have been obtained through a court proceeding before the bankruptcy case began; in some states a court judgment is a lien. In addition, to the extent a creditor also owes money to the debtor (has a right of setoff), the creditor's claim may be a secured claim.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>(See also Unsecured Claim)</i></p>	<p><b>Unsecured Claim</b> If a claim is not secured it is an unsecured claim. A claim may be partly secured and partly unsecured if the property on which a creditor has a lien is not worth enough to pay the creditor in full.</p> <p><b>Unsecured Priority Claim</b> Certain types of unsecured claims are given priority, so they are to be paid in bankruptcy cases before most other unsecured claims (if there is sufficient money or property available to pay these claims). The most common types of priority claims are listed on the proof of claim form. Unsecured claims are not specifically given priority status by the bankruptcy laws are classified as <i>Unsecured Nonpriority Claims</i>.</p>
