

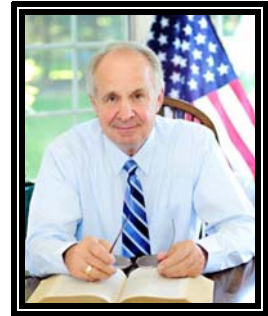

Idaho State Bar's Distinguished Lawyer Award



On Wednesday, July 13, 2011, United States Magistrate Judge Larry M. Boyle was awarded the Idaho State Bar's 2011 Distinguished Lawyer Award. The Distinguished Lawyer Award recognizes attorneys who have distinguished themselves through exemplary conduct, professionalism, and years of dedicated service to the legal profession, and to the citizens of the State of Idaho. Judge Boyle was nominated for the award by members of the bar and a judicial colleague in recognition of his 39 years in the legal profession, including 25 years as a state and federal judge. Additionally, Terry L. Derden, Deputy Director of the Executive Office of United States Attorneys, Washington, D.C., made a presentation to Judge Boyle for his outstanding service to the Department of Justice and the Executive Office for United States Attorneys Office of Legal Education.

Judge Boyle received his law degree from the University of Idaho nearly 40 years ago, and has served the legal profession and the federal and state judiciary with honor and distinction. He has served as a state district judge, Justice of the Idaho Supreme Court, and as a federal judge. Judge Boyle has served on advisory boards of both the University of Idaho and Brigham Young University colleges of law, and as a guest lecturer at those and several other law schools including Notre Dame University and George Mason University.

In addition to hearing federal court cases, he is a frequent instructor at the U.S. Department of Justice National Advocacy Center, and has been requested by the Justice Department to teach the rule of law and American jurisprudence to judges in Azerbaijan, a former Soviet Union province. He taught the rule of law, human and civil rights, and other topics to judges and prosecutors in The Islamic Republic of Pakistan. He has also taught appellate and trial advocacy to law students in Kiev and Simferopol, Ukraine.
