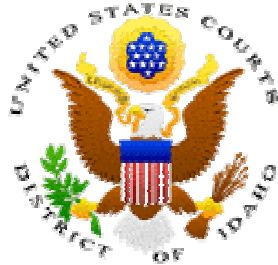


## United States District and Bankruptcy Court For the District of Idaho



### Receiving ECF Notices

Pursuant to general order 187, all attorneys practicing law in the federal courts are required to sign up for access to the court's electronic case management system, CM/ECF. In turn, the CM/ECF system will send the official notices to parties via electronic mail.

The requirement to sign up for CM/ECF implies that email systems in law offices must be set to receive mail from the court. Many spam and virus filtering systems have been identified as refusing mail from the court. Furthermore, attorneys with a large practice in the federal court will receive a sufficient quantity of email traffic from the court that some spam filters will be triggered based on the high volume.

Please have your technical support personnel ensure that court email is not blocked by your filtering mechanisms. We recommend that you set your spam filter to allow traffic from the `uscourts.gov` domain, but if you want to get more specific, Idaho court staff email traffic will come from `id.uscourts.gov`, the district CM/ECF server traffic will come from `idd.uscourts.gov` and the bankruptcy server traffic from `idb.uscourts.gov`.

If your technical support staff still needs more specific details, all mail traffic coming from Idaho (all 9<sup>th</sup> circuit US Courts actually) will come from `lsmns1o.gtwy.uscourts.gov` using an IP address of 207.41.18.68. When the internal court mail system encounters an outage it will automatically fail over to an alternate address of `resns1o.gtwy.uscourts.gov` with an IP address of 207.41.14.62
