


## OTHER WORKLOAD INDICATORS

**A. Juror Utilization** During 2001, the number of jury trials conducted in the District of Idaho decreased by 28% after a 7% increase for the previous year. Not surprising, there was a corresponding drop in all categories including the number of jurors reporting, number of jurors selected / served and the number of jurors challenged. Given the 28% decrease in trials, the percentage of jurors “not selected, serving or challenged” actually fell a disproportionate amount (53%), thereby demonstrating the efficiency of the system as well as the diligence of the jury administration staff. Early last year, the District of Idaho implemented the new Jury Management System (JMS), a software system designed to standardize the jury process nationwide.

**B. Appeals Filed** Overall, the number of appeals filed during 2001 increased by 10%. This was primarily attributable to the 14% rise in civil appeals and a 6% jump in criminal appeals. The number of bankruptcy appeals declined by 8%.

**C. Criminal Justice Act (CJA)** During 2001, the number of Death Penalty vouchers processed skyrocketed by 96% which resulted in a corresponding increase in DP costs of 183%. Conversely, the number of CJA vouchers processed during 2001, decreased by 10% with CJA costs dropping 18%. Overall, the total Cost of Criminal Defense increased by 3% during the past calendar year despite a 1% decline in total vouchers, no doubt, directly attributable to the significant rise in the Death Penalty area.

**D. Naturalization Petitions** During 2001, six Naturalization ceremonies were conducted in Boise and one in Pocatello. The number of oaths certified decreased by 41% during 2001 after a 36% decline the previous year.

**E. New Attorneys** The number of new attorneys admitted in Idaho during 2001 increased by 33% from the prior year.



**F. Financial Transactions** The amount of restitution paid to victims continued to increase during 2001. As reflected in the chart below, this amount increased from about \$10,000 during 1996 to over \$384,000 during the past year. Likewise, the invested registry funds for both courts combined continued to soar. Over the past two years this amount has increased from just under \$3.2 million in 1999 to over \$10.4 million during 2001. In Bankruptcy Court, the amount of unclaimed funds continued to increase in both categories as did the amount of trustee unclaimed turnovers, which increased 14% during the past calendar year after a 43% rise the prior year. Conversely, the trustee fund declined by 24% during 2001.

The number of checks issued by the District Court increased by only 1%. This number includes the checks issued on behalf of Bankruptcy Court and Probation /Pretrial Services. Receipts issued by the District Court rose by 16% for the second successive year while Bankruptcy Court receipts went up by 7%.

**H. Voice Case Information System (VCIS)** The Voice Case Information System (VCIS) allows interested parties to query the BANCAP database via a standard touch tone telephone and receive voice information by means of computer synthesized sound. As reflected in the table below, the new version of VCIS dramatically changed the type of data capable of being tracked. Therefore, a meaningful comparison could be made on only one category, namely, the total number of calls received, which remained relatively constant.

**I. Internet Website Usage** The creation of the District of Idaho Homepage on the World Wide Web ([www.id.uscourts.gov](http://www.id.uscourts.gov)) has had a profound beneficial effect, as illustrated by the statistics below. Never before have so many people had instantaneous access to an absolute abundance of court-related information, concerning the District of Idaho as well as other courts and legal resources through the hyperlinks provided. During 2001, the growth rate was again significant, as reflected by nearly a 40% increase in virtually all categories. All information previously found in PACER (Public Access to Court's Electronic Records) is now available on the Internet Website.
