



ILHS Authors Earn Two “Best Article Awards” from *The Advocate*

Since 2006, the Idaho Legal History Society has sponsored an issue of the Idaho State Bar’s monthly magazine *The Advocate*. These issues have focused on various historical themes including the “Trial of the Century” involving “Big” Bill Haywood, loyalty oath cases in Idaho, the ILHS’ Oral History Project, and the history of legal education in Idaho.

Each year *The Advocate*’s Editorial Advisory Board selects one article published in its past year for its “Best Article” award. Criteria include: writing that is clear, concise and interesting; with information that is pertinent and relevant to members of the Bar. As a true testament to the good work done by ILHS members, *The Advocate*’s “Best Article” award has been presented to two ILHS authors in the past four years:

John F. Greenfield, Huntley Park, LLC, Boise, was awarded the 2006-2007 “Best Article” award by *The Advocate* for his article *Idaho Comes of Age in High Profile 1907 Murder Case* which appeared in the December 2006 issue.

Debora K. Kristensen, Givens Pursley, LLP, Boise, was awarded the 2008-2009 “Best Article” award by *The Advocate* for her article entitled *Perspectives from the Past: Oral Histories of Idaho Lawyers and Judges* which appeared in the November/December 2008 issue.
