**GENERAL ORDER NO. 466**

It appearing that the Honorable Brent R. Wilson has been appointed and commenced service as a United States Bankruptcy Judge for the District of Idaho effective October 6, 2025; and

It further appearing that it is necessary to assign responsibility for the cases pending and to be filed in this District to the active Bankruptcy Judges;

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:**

1. All bankruptcy cases, and all adversary proceedings arising therein or related thereto, pending on October 9, 2025, and currently assigned to Chief Judge Noah G. Hillen or a visiting bankruptcy judge shall remain assigned to Chief Judge Hillen or the visiting judge except as otherwise ordered in individual cases.
2. All bankruptcy cases, and all adversary proceedings arising therein or related thereto, filed with this Court on or after October 9, 2025, wherein the debtor(s) resides in the following counties shall be assigned to Chief Judge Hillen for all purposes and proceedings: Benewah, Bonner, Boundary, Clearwater, Idaho, Kootenai, Latah, Lewis, Nez Perce and Shoshone.
3. All bankruptcy cases, and all adversary proceedings arising therein or related thereto, filed with this Court on or after October 9, 2025, wherein the debtor(s) resides in the following counties shall be assigned to Judge Brent R. Wilson for all purposes and proceedings: Bannock, Bear Lake, Bingham, Blaine, Bonneville, Butte, Camas, Caribou, Cassia, Clark, Custer, Franklin, Fremont, Gooding,

Jefferson, Jerome, Lemhi, Lincoln, Madison, Minidoka, Oneida, Power, Teton and Twin Falls.

4. All bankruptcy cases, and any adversary proceedings arising therein or related thereto, wherein the debtor(s) resides in the following counties shall be randomly assigned by the Clerk of Court to either Chief Judge Hillen or Judge Wilson for all purposes and proceedings, in such proportion as the Chief Bankruptcy Judge shall from time to time instruct the Clerk: Ada, Adams, Boise, Canyon, Elmore, Gem, Owyhee, Payette, Valley, Washington (and referred Malheur County, Oregon cases).
5. The Chief Bankruptcy Judge may establish, from time to time and as necessary, any other case assignment protocols to address long-term conflicts with any party, attorney, or trustee, and shall relay the same to the Clerk.
