GENERAL ORDER No. 10

IT IS ORDERED:

That from the date hereof and until further order of this Court the Boise Magistrate will be assigned the following duties in addition to those presently being carried out:

1. All initial criminal arraignments at Boise will be conducted by the Magistrate. All defendants will be required to enter a plea of "not guilty." Forms provided by the Court providing for application by the defendant to the Court to enter a plea of "guilty" will be supplied by the Magistrate at the arraignment to each defendant or his counsel. Such forms may be utilized by defendants who desire to enter a plea of "guilty," or who may subsequently determine to change the "not guilty" plea to a plea of "guilty."
2. All pretrial discovery proceedings in criminal cases at Boise are hereby referred to the Magistrate.
3. All appeals from adverse rulings of the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare in Social Security matters are hereby referred to the Magistrate. The Magistrate will

promptly review the entire file in such appeals, including a transcript of the administrative proceedings. A written recommendation of proposed action will be furnished to the Court as promptly as work conditions make practical.

4. The Magistrate is specifically authorized to handle any civil discovery procedures specifically assigned in writing by one of the judges of the Court.

5. In addition to the foregoing, the Boise Magistrate is hereby authorized to undertake any and all power, authority and jurisdiction authorized by law for part-time magistrates.

SUBJECT: Attached General Order

As you will note by the attached copy of a General Order, the United States Magistrate in Boise will be conducting all arraignments and all pre-trial discovery proceedings in criminal matters. Other additional duties such as appeals from adverse rulings from the Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare will also be handled by the Magistrate.

The ramifications of the General Order will require substantial cooperation between all supporting offices.

We are arranging a two-day seminar for the parttime Magistrates and their secretaries in the Grand Jury room on April 19 & 20, 1979. Some of the areas which will be covered are as follows:

1. Transfer of our Central Violations Bureau into a consolidated bureau in Denver, Colorado.
2. Arraignment transfer to Magistrates, i.e. procedures, resources, etc. Special emphasis on the Speedy Trial Act will be covered as the sanctions will become effective on July 1, 1979.
3. We will attempt to have a member of the Administrative Office, Magistrates Division, available to answer questions.
4. A time will be set within the program for the U.S. Attorney's office, U.S. Marshal's Service and U.S. Probation office. It is suggested that this time be utilized as a problem solving session. Any problem areas of concern to these offices should be reduced to writing and submitted to the Clerk as soon as possible so adequate time can be allocated.

Your full cooperation and participation in these matters is respectfully requested.
